AAA Tribute and Fifth Year Celebration

Towards the end of last September, we marked our fifth-year anniversary and paid tribute to the remarkable life of AAA founder Kevin Jenkins OBE. The day, held at the Terence Brown Arc in the Park on Saturday 25th September, was truly memorable, with hundreds of friends, supporters, staff and trustees coming together to celebrate, pay tribute and share many fond memories.

The event, which will live long in the memory, included a whole host of fun activities for local families and was centered around a special tribute hour in honour of Kevin, which included speakers, a tree planting ceremony led by his family, culminating in rousing performances from our very own Abbey Hub Choir and All Stars performance group, made up of young people with Special Educational Needs or Disabilities attending our youth projects at the Arc.

Hundreds of local children, young people and their families enjoyed many workshops and activities delivered as part of the celebrations, from Lego building, arts and crafts workshops, team sports, bouncy castles, boxing coaching sessions, puppet shows and giant board games, there was something on offer for everyone. Awards and certificates were presented to AAA children and young people during the day and a formal opening of the Arc's edible gardens area was led by AAA Chair of Trustees Christine Bowden, along with young people who benefit from the space.

We would like to thank all friends, supporters and colleagues who joined us, to celebrate AAA's journey so far and to pay such a fitting and memorable tribute to Kevin.











Kevin Jenkins OBE Annual Christmas Toy Appeal 2021

The lead up to Christmas tends to be one of the busiest times of the year at Ambition Aspire Achieve and Christmas 2021 proved to be no exception. The 44th Christmas Toy Appeal, supported by the **Newham Recorder**, was renamed on its launch back in November as the **'Kevin Jenkins OBE Newham Christmas Toy Appeal'** in memory of its founder, and was needed more than ever this year, given all the surrounding challenges experienced by vulnerable children and their families so heavily impacted by the Covid-19 pandemic.

The 2021 Appeal had many highlights. Supported by 42 business supporters, 6 schools and 5 surrounding charities/charitable trusts, along with local churches, faith groups and many more generous individuals, who donated thousands of toys. This year we exceeded our target, providing a stocking full of gifts for over 2,900 vulnerable children, to open on Christmas morning - a fitting tribute for the Appeal's founder.

Despite Covid-19 restrictions rising, volunteers kindly gave time in the toy warehouse provided by appeal partner Quattro Plant Hire, with many businesses, including Mace Construction, Lego, Axis, All Funds and Gallions Reach providing teams of volunteers to help pack toys. There was even a visit from a BBC news team, who featured the Appeal on a piece that was broadcasted on BBC lunchtime news on Christmas Eve! And thanks to further donations, over 150 seasonal food hampers were delivered to vulnerable local families during the last week of the Appeal, with delivery supported by local distribution firm Menzies Distribution. Christmas is a special time at Ambition Aspire Achieve and following all the challenges of recent times, we were determined to open-up our Christmas themed parties and pantomimes once again, with funding support for Christmas activities kindly provided by AAA patron **Glyn Hopkin**.

Children and young people across our clubs at Arc in the Park and Abbey Hub enjoyed many fun Christmas themed parties, pantomimes and thanks to additional funding provided by the DfE **Holiday Activities Fund,** we delivered new activities for large numbers of children with Special Educational Needs or Disabilities at Abbey Hub during the Christmas school holiday break. Children attending had the chance to enjoy Christmas themed trips organised as part of our programme, including an ice-skating trip to North Greenwich and a visit to the Wetlands Centre to enjoy Xmas lights and illuminations.





Our **Community Christmas Trees** enterprise ran once again in the lead up to Christmas, to raise important funding for our work. During December we sold and delivered over 200 real Christmas trees, raising over £8k to support key areas in 2022, boosting funding for our Mersea Island summer camps and annual sailing trip for young people next year.

Our Nordman Firs and Norway Spruces were purchased by individual supporters, schools and corporate sponsors with Chancellor Rishi Sunak once again purchasing trees for the No.11 lobby and flat, delivered to Downing Street during the first week of December! Thank you to all our customers this year, your Xmas tree purchases were greatly appreciated helping to make a difference.



Arc Updates

As we gear up for the spring and busy summer months, our regular projects and activities at the **Terence Brown Arc in the Park** continue to be ever popular, with hundreds of local children and young people accessing our clubs and after-school activities delivered throughout the week and weekends.

A regular fixture at the Arc is our **Saturday Cycling Club**. The club welcomes on average 15 young people every week, ranging from children who want to learn how to ride a bike, to young people working towards completing Bikeability courses, giving them the confidence and knowledge to ride safely on the streets and roads in the future.

We are extremely fortunate to benefit from a dedicated volunteer team, who help to deliver the club every week. Arnold and his colleagues from **Newham Cyclists** have recently supported the club to provide fun ride outs around the local area and bike maintenance sessions, providing the opportunity for children to learn new skills on how to maintain their own bikes. The Newham Cyclists also recently organised a cycle ride to the Olympic Park for 12 young people, supported by two AAA staff and 4 volunteers. The young people really enjoyed the activity, with one child marking the trip by saying "this was the best time ever!".

We would like to take an opportunity to say a huge thank you to Arnold and all the volunteers from Newham Cyclists for their continued support and dedication, which is truly appreciated by everyone at AAA, our young people and their parents.

Other popular weekend fixtures at the Arc include our **Sunday Explorers Club** and **Saturday Multi-Sports** clubs, providing opportunities for children and young people, including those with Special Educational Needs or Disabilities to try new sports and activities, learn new skills and develop new interests, all whilst having lots of fun!

Abbey Hub Updates









Our regular activities, after-school clubs, weekend clubs and family days at the **Glyn Hopkin Abbey Hub** received a boost this year thanks to funding awarded by corporate partner **BAIN Capital**. With their support, we can continue to grow and develop our offer at the Hub during 2022, providing much needed opportunities for local children and young people residing in the area. Our offer for SEND young people accessing the hub is also growing, with funding secured to deliver school holiday provision for groups this year. Along with our after-school clubs and groups, our **Abbey Cycles** weekend cycling club has also been in high demand, with more children joining up recently. Those attending have been learning cycling skills and enjoying regular trips out in and around the Stratford area.

In March, the staff team at the Hub marked International Women's Day, inviting girls who regularly attend sessions along with their mothers to enjoy a pamper session, with candles, flowers, biscuits and mocktails all on offer! Our young people enjoyed pampering their mums who also thoroughly enjoyed the experience with one quoting "it's nice for me to spend some quality time with my daughter and feel appreciated!".

And there are exciting times ahead this year, with the development of the main building at Abbey Hub about to begin, following grant funding secured from the **LLDC** last year. We are also very excited about the prospect of developing a new outdoor learning facility, in the woodland space adjacent to Abbey Hub, kindly gifted to AAA by **Thames Water** recently. With a number of partners already on-board pledging support for the project, we look forward to sharing further updates on this fantastic development in future newsletters!

Project Spotlight – Moving On & Up

In 2021 we established a new employability and personal development project, 'Moving On & Up', for young people aged 14-19, with sessions delivered to support their transition from school into ongoing progression opportunities including further learning, apprenticeships and paid employment. With funding generously provided by the Newham Rotary Club, we provided targeted support to twelve young people with the group demonstrating excellent progress

As a result of the sessions attendees showed improved communication and problem-solving skills through their completion of a series of games and workshops. Young people attending also worked towards Bronze Arts Awards, developing their knowledge and experience of music production and the arts by utilising our fantastic recording studio at the Arc. Thanks to a new grant awarded recently via the Lyle Community Fund, we hope to expand this project during 2022, including introducing new elements of personal and professional mentoring, to enable young people to reach their full potential.

Project Spotlight – This Is Me



We are delighted to announce a brand-new project, thanks to a grant secured in February as part of the **Winter Pressures Fund/Inequalities Grant** opportunities.

'This is Me' meets an identified need following a number of consultations with young people attending our weekly youth groups at Arc in the Park. The new project will deliver twice-weekly support groups over the coming year for young people who identify as LGBTQ+ or who are exploring their gender identity.

The sessions will be facilitated at the Arc in the Park Lodge, providing a safe stand-alone space, supporting young people to discuss issues, explore ideas around their identities, whilst delivering a range of workshops and activities focused on building confidence and wellbeing, helping to identify ongoing progression opportunities. As part of the project, selected members of the AAA team will also benefit from LGBTQ+ awareness training and mentoring training, to support delivery.


Brick Lane Music Hall Benefit Evening
